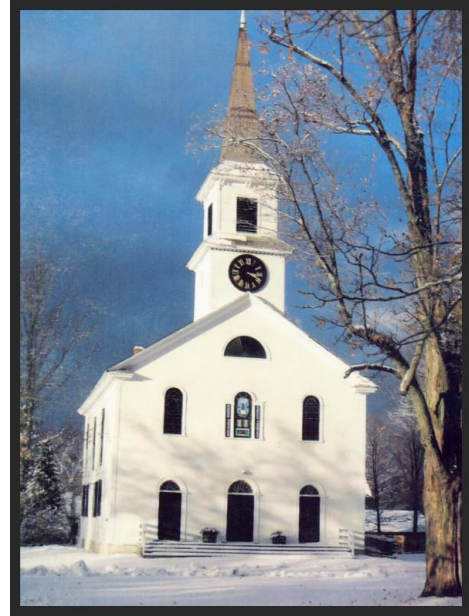
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LCHIP Spotlights

CORNISH MEETINGHOUSE

Built in 1803, the Cornish Meetinghouse was dismantled and moved to its present location in 1818. Originally a fine example of rural federal architecture, the Meetinghouse, like many others, underwent an extensive renovation in the 1840s, which included the removal of the gallery, box pews, high pulpit and soundboard, as well as the reconfiguration of the interior and windows, which introduced Greek Revival details to the building.

The Meetinghouse underwent another change in 1883, when the steeple was renovated in the popular Stick Style. The Trustees of the Cornish Meetinghouse were awarded a 2014 grant of \$54,100 to help secure the exterior envelope of the building.

WESTMORELAND PARK HILL MEETINGHOUSE

The Westmoreland Park Hill Meetinghouse and Historical Society has received three LCHIP grants, the most recent coming in 2014. A grant of \$27,936 was awarded to help with repair of many of the steeples decorative wooden elements, metal tier roofing and to paint the steeple and building. The work, which began in early this past summer, is nearly complete!
